As Naples Jewish Congregation (NJC) prepares to celebrate its 25th year of life, The Naples Press commemorated the special occasion by publishing an article

Jane Galler, the cantorial soloist, recalls the sense of belonging and comfort that she felt nearly 20 years ago, when she first started her tenure at NJC.

NJC's Rabbi, Howard Herman, recalls starting as an interim Rabbi until he was hired as NJC's spiritual leader some six years ago. He progressively felt the uniqueness of the congregation and recently signed a five year contract. Rabbi Herman reflected how he is constantly impressed with the congregation's blend of a "caring personality and its thirst for spiritual learning."

Harriet interviewed some of the longstanding members, Marilyn and Barry Goldenberg, and Chuck Naumoff, who shared some of their enduring memories along with the pervasive spirit of support and consideration for one another.

The themes of love, mutual support and friendship, the article poses, extend to a commitment to social and civic responsibilities. Steve McCloskey proudly goes through the long list of activities, programs and projects that focus on the world around the NJC.

The article explains that NJC is an adult congregation that maintains a partnership with the Unitarian-Universalist Congregation where worshiping takes place on three Friday nights and one Saturday morning.

We, at NJC, are proud of 25 years of strong spirit and commitment and are grateful to the Naples Press and Ms. Heithaus for sharing with their readers.
